# Dyslexia Awareness

Through my first job out of college, I was trained in the Orton-Gillingham methodology. As a dyslexic myself, I was astounded at how accessible reading and spelling could be if provided with the correct tools. Explicit phonics instruction was not available to me growing up. Instead, I made it through undergrad with a haphazard mix of compensatory strategies, tutoring, compassionate teachers, a whole lot of luck and stubbornness. After becoming a certified member of the Orton-Gillingham Academy, I moved back to Boston to attend graduate school. I earned a dual masters and licensure in Special Education and Social Work from Boston University and worked in a variety of roles in the rapeutic educational programs and as an ABA therapist until I started at Milestones in 2011. Since then, the reading department has grown in scope and talent. There are many reasons I love working at MDS. Primarily though, I love that this school is truly dedicated to the concept of individualized education.



When I am not teaching reading, I'm usually reading with my two young kids.

**Reading has Significant Academic Benefits** 

- <u>5 minutes a day</u> → exposed to 282,000 words per year
- 20 minutes a day → exposed to 1.8 million words per year
- Reduces stress
- Builds vocabulary
- Increases prior knowledge
- Builds visual comprehension
- Reinforces English syntax
- Strengthens fluency



IT started a new service cleaning staff & student computers.




