Milestones has seen an increase in referrals for students with Reading disabilities, resulting in 27% of our neurodiverse population diagnosed with Specific Learning Disabilities that impact Reading. In response to this increasing need, here's what's new as of 2025.

Literacy Profile: All grades

Students with a diagnosed or suspected Specific Learning Disability: A literacy profile is created that outlines strengths and vulnerabilities across all language and literacy domains, resulting in student-specific recommendations for both in- and out-of-classroom settings.

OG certification for Teachers: Elementary

Special Education teachers attended an intensive 60 hours Orton-Gillingham training through The Institute of Multi-Sensory Education. This approach combines the science of reading and structured literacy to provide students with high-level and data-driven literacy instruction.

Daily Reading Block for students: Elementary

A dedicated daily Reading block, led by a OG certified Special Educator or Reading Specialist. Students are placed in reading groups tailored to their current reading needs. Students work towards

their individual IEP goals and build essential literacy skills in reading comprehension, phonics, vocabulary, and fluency.

Our multidisciplinary teams (clinical and academic) provide direct and embedded therapeutic instruction focusing on building skills in the areas of: academics & learning differences, executive functioning, psychological resilience, emotional regulation, sensory/motor, and social communication. Our high school and post-high school students generalize skill acquisition by participating in internships and externships, community-based instruction, and if desired college courses. Students emerge with the confidence and skills to achieve a variety of successes, including re-entry to public school, meaningful relationships, fulfilling employment, and college admissions.
